The UK is leaving its European moorings and seeking a new and different world position at a time of economic and political disruption exacerbated by Covid-19. Globalisation is in retreat and old enmities are re-asserting themselves as states compete for power, resources and influence. Instances of hybrid conflict are numerous and increasing, combining irregular and proxy warfare with cyber operations. National and international structures and institutions are under attack from information operations intended to influence, interfere with, subvert and undermine trust and good order. The political, economic and social challenges to the UK demand ambition, capability, judgement and realism. The UK has deployable strengths but its reputation is not at its highest. The geopolitical effects of Covid-19 are for the most part still unclear and public opinion is bound to have been affected by the pandemic. Defence, security and other arms of the state face unexpected dilemmas in a critical period when key decisions will have to be taken. Themes have been discussed with senior officers and other officials to give this project as much utility as possible in light of the Reviews that are to be held.

**Super conclave/
final major podcast: Public confidence, engagement and support**

Themes:

- Can we limit disinformation and distortion?
- Threats to our democracies from state opponents
- The political system and public engagement
- Are there concerning strengths and weaknesses in the political system?
- Can we marshal popular support?

This project will include webinars, podcasts (30-50 minutes each) and two private, interactive webclave discussions. The podcasts will be recorded, edited and then distributed across our networks. The webclaves will follow the format of our private conclave discussions, with short contributions from several panellists followed by comments from a chair who will proceed to moderate an extended interactive discussion with a select group of decision makers and influencers. Each will take place strictly under the Chatham House Rule and last 90 minutes, including a 15 minute break. An unattributed summary note will be produced for circulation to participants and a wider distribution list to be discussed and agreed. In the late Autumn, the Global Britain series will conclude either with a super conclave or a major podcast. The format to be discussed with panellists and potential sponsors.
