Threatvine unites financial services and wider critical national infrastructure, law enforcement and academia, moving beyond cyber-security information sharing to collaborative cyber-security intelligence analysis. Threatvine can help minimise risk and reduce fears, by allowing you to work together to be proactive and prepared against cybercrime; keeping you one step ahead of the cyber threat. Threatvine was built for the UK NCSC to power CiSP, the UK's national platform for cyber security information sharing. It was described by the Financial Times at launch as a “secure Facebook for cyber threats.”

Threatvine’s appeal is global, from Japan to Brazil, and it enables compliance with regulations, such as NISD, mandating cyber incident reporting. It uses data integrations, including MISP, to allow enriched data analysis, which combined with the collaboration between people, means you can get real intelligence from your threat intelligence.
